The Hotel

Picture a fascinating Tudor manor almost unchanged by time. Now lovingly restored as a beautiful hotel. The hotel holds a Grade 1 listing for architectural and historical interest and lies close to Stratford Upon Avon and Broadway, and the whole of the lovely Cotswolds and Shakespeare country are on the doorstep.

Salford Hall was originally built as a guest residence for the monks of nearby Evesham Abbey, probably in the time when Richard Hawkesbury was Abbott. Like many a mediaeval Friar Tuck he was noted for good living. It seems appropriate that the Hall should now become a luxury hotel since its founder had such a reputation for extravagant living.

This hotel is completely non smoking.



Bedrooms

All 34 bedrooms, eight with four-posters are named after historical personages connected with the Hall and its story and are individually decorated with period furniture and luxurious fitments. Each room has all the facilities you would expect to make each guests stay a pleasure. The bedrooms are situated in two buildings, the Main Hall and Tudor Court, a former coach house and granary, enclosing a garden.

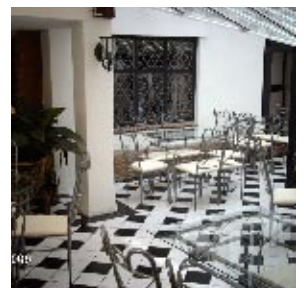

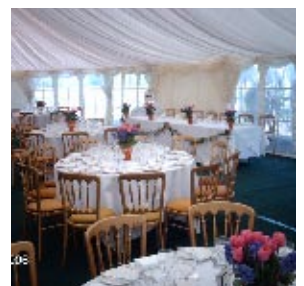

Weddings

Exclusive use of the hotel may be taken which includes the use of all the public rooms and gardens, 34 bedrooms.





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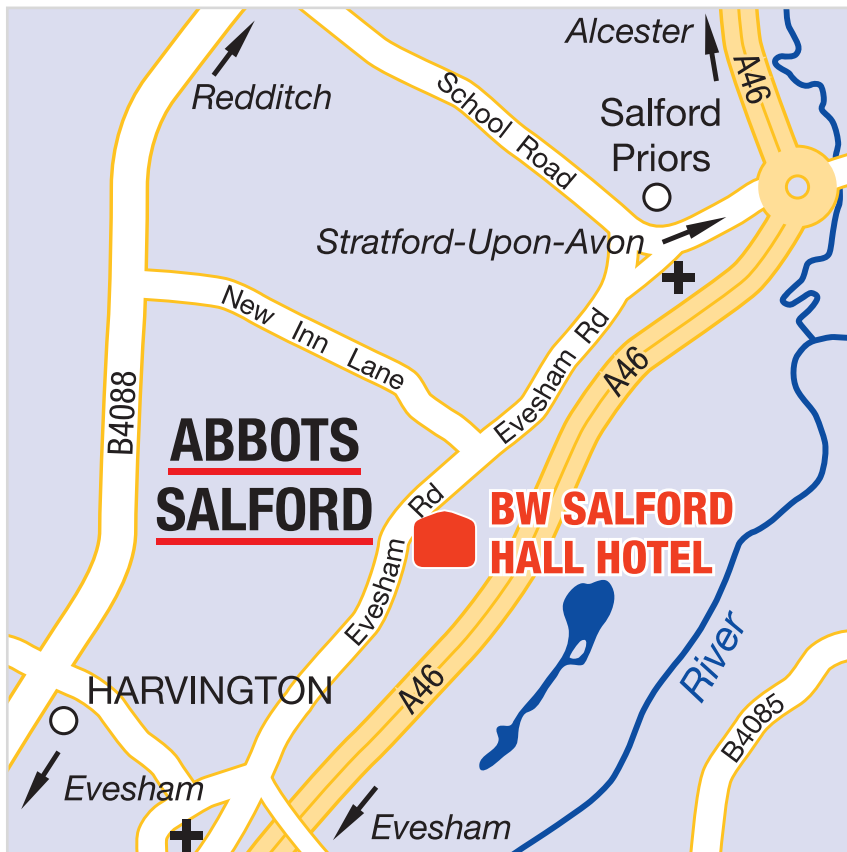
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Directions & Maps

From London, leave the M40 at Junction 15 (Warwick) onto the A46 to Stratford which you will by pass, continue on the A46 towards Evesham until a roundabout directs you to Salford Priors, Abbots Salford and Harvington. Salford Hall is on the left about one and half miles from the roundabout. From Bristol and the South-West, leave the M5 at Junction 9 (Tewkesbury), follow the A46 round Evesham and towards Stratford, continue on the A46 towards Stratford until a roundabout directs you to Salford Priors, Abbots Salford and Harvington. Salford Hall is on the left about one and half miles from the roundabout.

From the North-West via M6 and North-East via the M1, join the M42 and leave at Junction 3. Take the A435 and join the A46 at the roundabout direction Evesham until a roundabout directs you to Salford Priors, Abbots Salford and Harvington. Salford Hall is on the left about one and half miles from the roundabout.
